## Water Polo

Welcome to the 2023/2024 Ireland Water Polo Season.
The fixtures for the coming season can now be found on the Ireland Water Polo app and website. Below is the formats of the league and cup for the coming season which has been prepared by the Fixture secretary and approved by the competitions and National Water Polo Committee.

Every effort where possible has been made to avoid clashes with leagues of the same gender/age grade as well as with National Squad training sessions. Given the amount of time that has been put into preparing the fixtures and to ensure all clubs have a settled fixture list for the season ahead, no requests to change fixtures will be allowed. Any withdrawals before the commencement of the season will result in a $€ 500$ fine.

All competitions for the coming season will be conducted in accordance with the Ireland Water Polo and World Aquatics rules (https://www.worldaquatics.com/rules/competition-regulations) except for rule 4.3 (where all games shall have a winner at full time). Due to our current restrictions on pool time, the addition of penalty shoot outs in the event of a draw in league games will not be possible. This will be reviewed again for the 2024/2025.

## Results

For league games points shall be awarded as follows:
Win-3 Points
Draw-1 Point
Loss - 0 Points

Where teams are tied with the same number of points in the final points table and where a decision must be reached in relation to final positions, it shall be decided as laid out in 13.7 of the Ireland Water Polo rule book (See Annex A).

For cup competitions (Including the ISC Qualifiers) the new world aquatics rule 4.3 will be implemented.
All matches shall have a winner at full time in any game. For group games points will be awards as follows:

Win in regular time-3 Points
Win after PSO-2 Points
Loss after PSO - 1 Point
Loss in regular time - 0 Points

Where teams are tied in the group phase of a cup competition, places should be decided as laid out in Appendix $9-4.1$ of the World Aquatics rule book (Annex B).

## Match/Team Sheets

To assist with the use of digital match sheets for the $23 / 24$ season, Coaches/Team managers will have access to input their team list into the competition management system in advance of their league games. An online training session for this will be given in advance of the season starting.

If a player does not hold a Swim Ireland registration \& a competitive Water Polo License, they will not be visible in the system to be able to be selected on the match sheet.

## Water Polo Caps

## Walkover Fees

Walkover charges for the $23 / 34$ season will be $€ 400$ for matches in the international pitches, $€ 300$ for all other $4 \times 8 / 4 \times 7$ matches and $€ 200$ for $4 \times 5$ matches.
3 Walkovers in a season will result in elimination from the league.

## Cup Team Lists

Clubs will input their team lists for the above cup competitions, into the competition management system by the relevant due date. An online training session for this will be given in advance of the season starting.

## Accreditation

Team Staff will require an accreditation for all cup competitions. This will need to be applied for by your club through the normal process for each competition. Athletes will move to annual accreditation after the affiliation deadline of the $14^{\text {th }}$ of October 2023.

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## Annex A - Rule 13.7 (Ireland Water Polo Rule Book)

### 13.7 Scoring

Winners of a fixture shall be awarded three points. A draw shall be awarded one point to each team. Where teams are tied with the same number of points in the final points table and where a decision must be reached in relation to final positions, it shall be decided as follows:
a) The team which has gained the most points in matches between the teams shall be ranked higher.
b) If the teams are still tied, the team with the largest difference between goals scored for and against in results between the teams shall be ranked higher.
c) If the teams are still tied, the team having scored the higher number of goals in matches between the teams will be ranked higher.
d) If there is still a tie, then the team with the largest difference between goals scored for and against in all matches shall be ranked higher.
e) If the teams are still tied, the team having scored the higher number of goals in all matches will be ranked higher.
f) If the teams are still tied, a playoff match shall be played.

## Annex B - Appendix 9-4.1 (World Aquatics Rule Book)

4.1 Tie Breaking Rules, Group phase or Round Robin Tournaments
4.1.1 If two (2) teams shall have equal points, further classification shall be established as follows:

The team winning the game between them (including penalty shoot-out if any) shall be placed higher. If there is more than one tie in a group, the highest placed tie shall be determined first.
4.1.2 If three (3) or more teams shall have equal points, further classification shall be established as follows:

The results among the tied teams shall determine which team is placed highest.
If, at any time during the application of the procedure, the number of tied teams is reduced to two (2), then the above procedure (1.2.1., tie between two teams) shall be used to determine which of the two (2) remaining teams is placed higher.

## The comparison shall be made:

First, upon the points of the games among the tied teams. second, the goal difference (excluding the goals from penalty shoot-out) among the tied teams, third, based upon goals scored among tied teams. If still tied, the games played against the highest placed team (or teams, if tied, the team or teams not involved in the tie) shall be considered. The first comparison shall be based on goal difference, and if still tied, then based on goals scored.

If still tied, the results against the next highest placed team (or teams, if tied) shall be used in succession until all results have been considered.
If still tied, and there is no practical manner to determine the ranking, the final classification between the teams in the tie shall be decided by coin-toss.
If there is more than one tie in a group, the highest placed tie shall be determined first.
For the purpose of calculating either goal difference or goals scored, the goals in any penalty shoot-out will not be taken into consideration
