Competition Location:	Bangor Aurora, Aquatic and Leisure Centre. 3 Valentine Road, Bangor BT20 4TH
Competition Format:	The competition will be played over 9 th 10 th 11 th May 2024 Male and Female competitions will be conducted in accordance with the Ireland Water Polo and World Aquatic Rules.
Competition Draws:	Competition draws were conducted in person and a recording of the draw was published.
Team Staff:	<p>Please note that all teams must have at least one qualified and licensed Level 2 Water Polo Coach on deck during every match.</p> <p>Any team staff attending this competition are required to meet the Swim Ireland Safeguarding and Vetting requirements.</p> <p>Only players and team staff accredited may enter the pool areas and participate in the competition.</p>
Team Sheets:	<p>All team lists of up to 15 players must be submitted via email by 1200 hrs Friday 12th April 2024 to aveencolvin@swimireland.ie</p> <p>Table Officials are to be notified of players not named for a specific match a minimum of 30 mins before the start of each match for any team that has more than 13 players listed.</p> <p>Team Lists may not be amended once the first match in the competition begins.</p>
Player Eligibility:	All players listed on team sheets must fulfil the eligibility criteria to compete in the ISC.
Team Leaders Meeting:	<p>A technical briefing will take place at 7.30pm on Tuesday 7th May via zoom at the link below. Entry Fee:	<p>Payment for ALL entries must be received by 17:00 Friday 3rd May, 2024</p> <p>Competition fees are as €1000 for Men's and €850 for Women's teams.</p> <p>Payment can be made Here</p> <p><u>Withdrawals after 4th March 2024 will incur the competition fee.</u></p>
Accreditation:	<p>Accreditation will be produced through the Go-Membership system by following This Link</p> <p>Club administrators will need to apply for accreditation for team managers and coaches.</p> <p>All team staff must have a photo on their profile before the application is made, they will be expected to wear them with photo on display while on the pool deck.</p>

	<p>Please ensure that team managers & coaches meet all the safeguarding/vetting/licensing requirements for accreditations, otherwise they will not be awarded.</p> <p>Accreditation applications must be completed 48hours before the first game begins.</p> <p>Accreditation lanyards & pouches should be reused from previous competitions. There will be a small supply available from the Tournament Director on the first day of the competition.</p>
Awards:	<p>Gold and Silver medals will be awarded in both competitions.</p> <p>A Most Valuable Player award will be made for both competitions, along with the selection of both male and female team of the tournament.</p>
Pool/Facility Staff:	<p>Team managers, officials and players are reminded to be courteous to the pool staff and to always obey instructions issued.</p> <p>Any dispute/altercation with staff should be reported to the Tournament Director by the Team Manager immediately.</p>
Respect for Officials/Teams	<p>All team staff and supporters are expected to show officials and opposition team's due respect.</p> <p>Any team and/or their supporters be found acting with unsportsmanlike behavior may be fined/sanctioned by the Tournament Director.</p>
Duration of Games:	<p>All matches will be 4 x 8 minutes with 2 TO's</p> <p>The ball used for this competition will be size 5 for Men and size 4 for Women</p>
Substitutions	<p>Flying substitutions in the lateral substitution area may be used by teams in all matches should the pitch set up allow.</p> <p>Pool set up equipment to be confirmed - details to be clarified at the team technical meeting.</p>
Points:	<p>Points shall be awarded as per World Aquatic Rules Jan 2024</p> <p>The matches shall be scored as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) win in regular time = 3 points b) win after penalty shootout = 2 points c) loss after penalty shootout = 1 point d) loss in regular = 0 point <p>In the event of a tie please refer to the tie breaking rules section. Appendix 9 Section 4.</p>
Referees:	<p>Referee's will be assigned by the NWPC and Ireland Water Polo Competitions Committee.</p>
Photography:	<p>Photography is only permitted by persons issued with a permit by the pools staff endorsed by the Tournament Director.</p> <p>Photographs may only be taken from the spectator area unless permission and accreditations have been issued prior to the competition beginning.</p> <p>Photographs must be in accordance with the Swim Ireland Filming & Photography Policy</p>
Team Benches:	<p>All assistant coaches, team managers and players not in the water during a match must always remain seated in the bench area and any person in breach of this rule shall receive a red card.</p> <p>A player who is excluded from the remainder of the game by way of 3 personal fouls, must remain on the team bench, with their cap on.</p> <p>A player excluded from the remainder of the game by the referee (for Violent Action) shall leave the team bench and proceed to the spectator area.</p>
Dress:	<p>All players and officials must be properly attired on the team bench.</p>

	<p>During presentation of teams prior to finals and prize giving all teams and officials will be dressed in team gear of t-shirts/shorts/tracksuits.</p> <p>It should be particularly noted by all, that swimsuits/togs are NOT permitted in the spectator area at any time. All teams must use the designated changing village for changing and /or dressing.</p> <p>Teams who do not comply will be sanctioned and officials may be excluded from the poolside for their teams next or subsequent match(es).</p>
Yellow & Red Cards	<p>All coaches and officials should lead by good example throughout the tournament.</p> <p>A Head Coach who receives a yellow card will not carry it forward to the next match.</p> <p>Any coach, team manager, official or player who receives a red card must immediately leave the poolside, without speaking to or communicating with his/her team. Once red carded, any coach may not attempt to coach/communicate with their team. Any attempt to do so, will result in removal from the pool facility and a further sanction.</p> <p>A coach, or other official who receives a red card shall be suspended for the next game.</p> <p>At Irish Senior Cup tournaments any player who is under the 1st Offence only, for Misconduct shall be granted an amnesty for the start of the tournament.</p> <p>Players who receive a red card for misconduct shall NOT be suspended for the next game if it is their first offence of the season.</p> <p>Please note that players who have received red cards for violent action during this season will have these cards carried through to this competition.</p> <p>Players/Coaches who receive red cards during this competition and who do not serve suspension's will have these cards carried forward to their next game after this competition/season.</p> <p>The Tournament Director may impose a penalty of missing an additional match(es) subject to the nature of the offence.</p> <p>A coach who receives a red card and consequent suspension, may not coach, or participate in a game involving a team in either competition until that suspension has been served.</p>
Violent Action:	<p>Any player excluded for the remainder of the game, with substitution when four minutes of actual play have elapsed, for committing a violent action shall be suspended for at least the next game. If it is a player's 2nd/3rd offence of the season the usual suspension rules apply.</p> <p>The Tournament Director on advice may impose a greater penalty due to the nature of the violent action.</p>
Penalty Shoot Out	In accordance with World Aquatic Rules Jan 2024 APPENDIX 6– Penalty Shoot Out
Health & Safety:	Please refer to the Health & Safety guidelines at the bottom of this document.
Alcohol:	Alcohol is not permitted in the spectator, pool or dressing room areas, those found in breach of this will be asked to leave the facility.
Appeals & Protests:	<p>All protest/appeals must be submitted in writing to the Tournament Director within 30 minutes of completion of any match or decision, accompanied by the appropriate fee.</p> <p>Any reason for protest known in advance must be submitted before the competition commences, accompanied by the appropriate fee.</p>

Swim Ireland Safety Statement

Safety is the responsibility of every individual involved in the sport.

**Risks identified must be reported to the Tournament Director
and formally reported to the facility operator.**

**We would ask the co-operation of athletes, coaches, spectators, and clubs in the
application of the following safety measures. They are in place for everyone's safety.**

All accidents must be formally reported.

General

- 1) By Law all facilities are required to have a Safety Statement in operation. Clubs and Competition Organisers should satisfy themselves that this is the case.
- 2) Any accidents, however minor, must be reported to Swim Ireland (standard Accident Report Form available).
- 3) ALL volunteers who work/help at Swim Ireland events are advised to read the Swim Ireland Safety Statement which is available upon request from the Office.

Clubs

- 1) All Clubs should obtain and read a copy of the Safety Statement of the pool they are hiring.
- 2) It is recommended that clubs identify risks and formally report them in writing to the relevant personnel at the facility.

All Competitions

(Club, Regional and National)

- 1) Following a competition at which an incident/accident occurred, the Organiser and/or Tournament Director must complete an Accident Report Form and include their contact details.
- 2) All who attend competitions are urged to report any accidents to either the Tournament Director. Where an accident occurs, Swim Ireland must be informed as soon as possible with a full report presented.

General;

- i. Everyone attending Competitions must familiarise themselves with the locations and operation of emergency exits.
- ii. Anyone observing anything they consider to be a safety hazard should report it to the Tournament director.
- iii. All those attending Competitions must take all steps to ensure their own safety and the safety of others.
- iv. All walkways must be kept clear of bags, equipment, etc.

Around the Pool (e.g. spectator area, foyer area, etc.)

- i. Athletes are not permitted to enter dry areas without first having changed and put on footwear.
- ii. Where there is a balcony or rail - athletes are not permitted to climb over it.
- iii. Glass bottles are not permitted outside designated refreshment areas.
